## **Kitchen Remode**

Timeline & Responsibilities Chart

This is a non-exhaustive chart to help you keep track of what will be going on week to week with an average kitchen remodel. Every remodel is different, but most things listed here will occur or need to be addressed. The larger the kitchen or the more complex the remodel (adding windows, opening walls, weaving into existing floors), the more time might be needed. We can make written modifications to fit your remodel, and any other issues will be addressed during the bid process.

This may need to be even earlier depending on which cabinet provider we use.</li> <li>Countertop/any granite/quartzite material should be chosen.</li> </ul>
Week 3	Drywall	<ul><li>Sink should be chosen.</li><li>Backsplash material should be chosen.</li></ul>
Week 4	Flooring install	<ul> <li>Paint color should be selected for walls and trim/ceiling if you have a preference (we have a standard white color used for both)</li> <li>If getting a custom mirror, the frame needs to be picked out by this time</li> </ul>
Week 5	<ul> <li>Cabinet install, measure for countertop install</li> <li>Trim installed</li> <li>Paint applied</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Faucet should be chosen.</li> <li>Any lighting should be chosen.</li> <li>Appliances should be onsite if able.</li> </ul>
Week 6	<ul> <li>Countertop installed</li> <li>Backsplash installed</li> <li>Mechanicals trimmed out</li> <li>Faucets installed</li> <li>Lighting installed</li> </ul>	
Week 7	<ul> <li>Flooring finish if needed</li> <li>Paint touchup if needed</li> <li>Appliances installed and hooked up.</li> <li>Clean up and dumpster hauled away</li> </ul>

### Things to keep in mind!
